Featuring several architectural styles, the museum itself is interesting, as its structure was first developed in 1899 and has evolved over many years. Visitors can enjoy meandering through massive galleries that focus on a variety of geographical locations: Mexico and Central America, Africa, Middle East, Egypt, Greece, and more. While you're here, you can also stroll the stunning and colorful gardens. There are special exhibitions on a rotating basis, so be sure to check the museums's website in advance.

The oldest in the U.S., the Philadelphia Zoo receives more than one million guests each year. You can easily spend a full day here, as the

42-acre space is home to more than 1,300 animals, including sloth bears, snow leopards, red pandas, and hippos. The zoo also has a "campus-wide network of see-through mesh trails," Zoo360, which allows the animals to travel around the grounds. Meanwhile, the kids will love the KidZooU, a children's education center, and the Rare Animal Conservation Center teaches visitors about animal endangerment and what's being done to promote conservationism.

Admire Art at the Esther M. Klein Art Gallery

The Esther M. Klein Art Gallery is a world-class center that focuses on the synergies between art and technology while supporting the surrounding Philadelphia neighborhoods. It's a branch of the University City Science Center, a non-profit organization that helps entrepreneurs bring their developments to market. The gallery features a variety of events throughout the year, including panel discussions, gallery presentations, lectures, and studio workshops by local artists. After a recent, multi-million dollar renovation, the University of Pennsylvania's stunning "1923 Penn Ice Rink" re-opened in late 2019. With an ice surface that's more than 16,000 square feet, it's no surprise that ice skaters love all the new enhancements: seating for 2,600 audience members, a skate-rental area, a viewing area above the ice, and food concessions. They offer figure skating lessons and adult league ice hockey, and it's open to special events as well.
